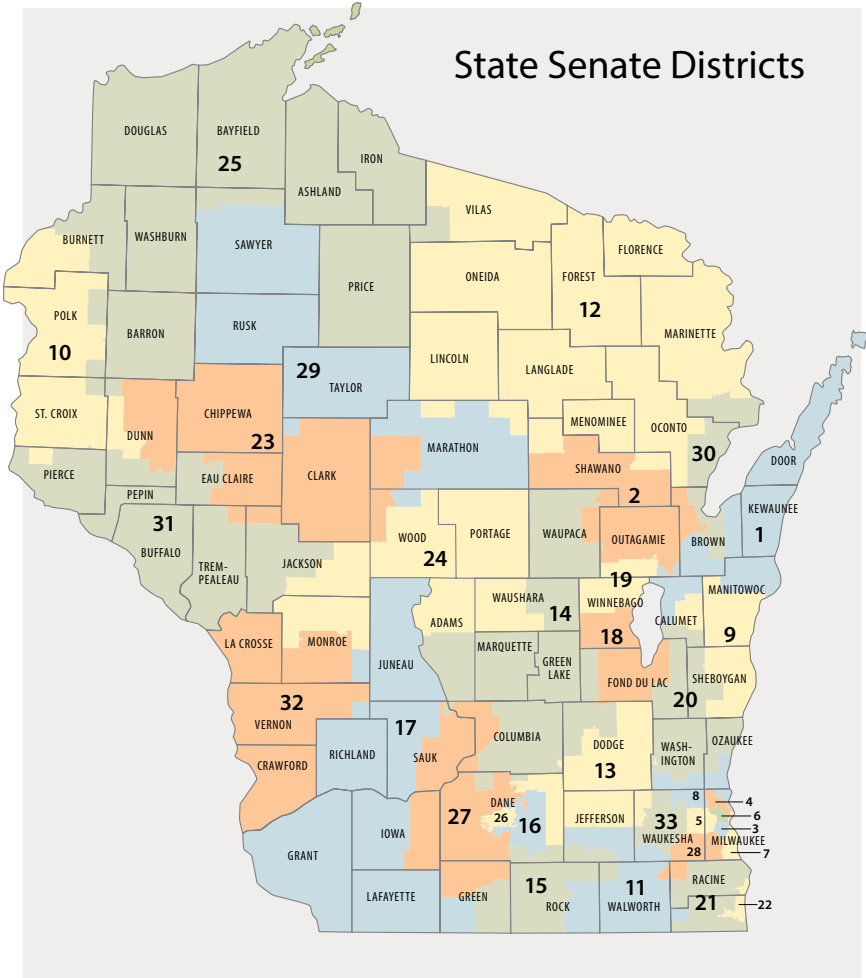


STATE LEGISLATURE



The Wisconsin Constitution requires the state legislature to redraw the state assembly and senate districts, based on population, following each U.S. Census. Accordingly, after the 2010 Census, 2011 Wisconsin Act 43 established the current districts. The legislature will create new districts using the 2020 U.S. Census data. The Wisconsin Constitution additionally requires that senate districts be “convenient contiguous territory” and that “no assembly district [be] divided in the formation of a senate district.” Under 2011 Wisconsin Act 43, each senate district comprises three whole and contiguous assembly districts, numbered in consecutive order: for example, Senate District 1 is comprised of Assembly Districts 1, 2, and 3.
